Oscar H. Regensburg, of the Class of 1890, died of Bright's disease on the 3d of August last at his home in Venice, Cal, in the 47th year of his age.

His geniality, untiring energy, resourcefulness, and conscientiousness, aided by an intelligent mind, made him of great use to his fellow deaf when any project of theirs needed a man with a "push;" and he was ever ready to give that push and to keep the thing going. The Pas-a-Pas Club, of Chicago, and the Moving-Picture Fund from which the deaf are now deriving so much pleasure, owe their existence largely to his energy and intelligence; and thereby, as also by his connection with the National Fraternal Society of the Deaf, in which he latterly took much interest, his memory will long be kept green in the hearts of a large circle of friends.
